QGIS for Classical Studies

Toletum, the "Network for Studies of the Iberian Peninsula in Antiquity" is hosting an online course for the Geoinformation System QGIS, which is addressed to Postgraduates and Postdocs of Classical Studies (especially Archaeology, History and Epigraphy).

The aim of the course is to learn how to use QGIS from basics to first analyses. The course is based on a written Training Manual starting from a blank project. This online manual is supplemented by online presentations, documents and personal guidance of two QGIS researchers. The content is based on open source data, focused on Classical Studies of the Iberian Peninsula. The focus of the material can easily be adjusted to other regions and studies.

The course is hosted online at Github and will open for participants on Thursday the 15th of October. The course runs till Thursday the 22nd of October, when the *"TOLETUM XI. Workshop "Antike Digital" – Digital Humanities in der Erforschung der Iberischen Halbinsel in der Antike"* starts. Everyone who participates in the Workshop has the chance to have a personal closing meeting with the lecturers in Hamburg that day.

Prospective **participants** should have advanced skills in English and an own computer with Internet connection to run the course. Knowledge in GIS is not necessary, the course is planned for Beginners. Participants are free in setting their timetable during the course. The course will take about 20-24 hours to complete and it is free of charge.
